Representative Experience

• Successfully represented reinsurer in arbitration, defeating cedent's attempt to require the reinsurer to place almost \$2 billion in a trust account established for the cedent's benefit.



- Successfully represented party in breach of contract and fiduciary duty arbitration with \$80 million in claimed damages brought by a major insurance carrier against its managing general underwriter for alleged underwriting quideline violations.
