# **Representative Experience**

- Obtained a decisive seven-figure judgment following a two-week trial against a module manufacturer who supplied defective modules and refused to honor its warranty.
- Obtained a \$35.5 million arbitration award following a two-week, 22 witness evidentiary hearing against an
  engineer that specified and furnished defective equipment for three solar facilities, resulting in the production of
  significantly lower amounts of electricity than promised to the off-takers.
